






## Breakdown of Venue (Tokyo Big Sight) Participants









Following the opening video, Governor Koike took the stage and delivered the opening speech.










## **Results of Visitor Survey to Improve the Next Event**

Approximately 80% of survey respondents had stated "very satisfied" or "satisfied," and many positive feedbacks were received. On the other hand, improvements are needed in terms of the venue and operations, especially in the areas of UI/information dissemination, including the website, app, and local maps.



#### [ Comments evaluating the event ]

- It is highly international, making it a rare and valuable event.
- There was diversity, with people of all ages, genders, many foreign participants, and it was lively and had a positive networking atmosphere.
- Opportunity to talk with startup ecosystem players from all over the world was very appealing.
- Opportunity to learn about the latest global trends in one place is great.
- Startup booths, sessions, and atmosphere of the venue were all better than last time.
- I participated last year as well and felt that it was better than last year.
- Although I participated online, the speakers in each program were good and it was worth listening to.

#### [ Improvement points for the next year ]

- The map was difficult to read, making it hard to find the stages and interview locations.
- It was a little difficult to obtain information, including from the website and app.
- The app was slow and difficult to navigate, was hard to find the booths I wanted to visit.
- It took a long time to enter. It might be a good idea to have several ticket issuing locations, like other exhibitions and events.
- It would be easier to understand if the timetables for sessions such as the VC Pavilion were unified.
- It would be good if students from more universities could attend.
- Would have liked a few more hands-on experience opportunities.
