SusHi Tech Tokyo 2025 What are we aiming for?

400 years ago, "Edo", ancient Tokyo practiced the principles of a Circular Economy. In May 2025, Modern Tokyo, inheriting that DNA, will become a hub for innovators and bold young challengers.
We eill envision the future of cities, spark innovation, and drive action – together. We will address humanity's global challenge:

Creating sustainable cities through cutting-edge technology.



The number of participants is at an all-time high. The inaugural Public Day had over 10,000 attendees.

- Number of participants: 57,000 (up 17,000 from the previous year, +44%), of which in-person attendance: 43,000 (up 20,000 from the previous year, +86%)
- A new public day was held, with 14,000 participants including families and middle and high school students, experiencing advanced technology from startups.

STARTUP HOKKAIDO Pavilion



This year marked our first participation in the event, with the aim of enabling exhibitors to connect with international markets and expand their reach. Additionally, the joint exhibition by multiple universities from Hokkaido, including Hokkaido University, alongside local municipalities, drew significant attention to the unified "All-Hokkaido" initiative. This experience reinforced the importance of ecosystem-building by municipalities and collaboration with universities.

Furthermore, from an international perspective, a standalone exhibition by Hokkaido would likely have limited impact. The decision to join forces under the "All-Japan" concept proved effective in attracting both domestic and international visitors. The strategic design of the exhibition area also played a key role in maximizing engagement and visibility.

Our participation in this event began after a site visit last year, which led to the opportunity to take part. Initially, Ehime Prefecture planned to exhibit independently, but after observing other regions collaborating through broader partnerships, we reached out to Hiroshima Prefecture, resulting in this joint exhibition.

At first, we were uncertain about the level of interest we might receive. However, thanks to the favorable location of our pavilion, we were delighted to welcome far more visitors than expected, which gave us a sense of relief. On Public Day, distributing local specialties such as mandarin orange juice and *momiji manju* (maple-leafshaped cakes) proved to be highly effective in drawing attention and engaging visitors.
